This enables children to understand how, overtime, changes happened and encourages them to evaluate their impact.

In addition to this, children celebrate the achievements of various famous British people thus enabling children to develop an awareness of how they have influenced and shaped the country in which we live. This includes an appreciation of the impact of their work and contributions.

Teaching children to respect and value diversity is embedded throughout the whole curriculum here at Childwall. In History, children are encouraged to show respect for different viewpoints and ideas which we promote during more in-depth discussions.
